Several of my students have recently made the comments like:

- “I wish my dog would behave like Aquaman.”
- “Your dogs are so good and they love to do sports”
- “Wow, look how they listen to you.”

This got me thinking....

What do I do that has my dogs behaving so well? I realized that it's not formal obedience, but how I interact with my dogs on a daily basis. It's about respect that goes both ways, it's having expectations, it's consistency, and it's so much more!

I'm not an animal behaviorist. I don't have special training in problem dogs or how to teach a dog to do a beautiful heeling pattern. But what I do know is how I build a special relationship with my dogs.

I want to share this information with you.

This seminar is to teach you how I accomplish this. It will include skills such as how I teach loose leash walking, recall, and several behaviors related to safety concerns. I'll give you tools on how to live with your dog to earn his respect, while also showing you how to respect your dog for the wonderful creature that he is.
